

LENT, HOLY WEEK & EASTER 2026

The season of Lent is a time of spiritual preparation and renewal for the celebration of Holy Week and Easter, the most important days in the Christian Year. All who belong to God's Holy Church are encouraged to keep a good Lent and to take a full part in the celebrations marking the days when Our Lord Jesus Christ suffered, died and rose again for us.

LENT In the season of Lent we recall the 40 days and 40 nights in which Our Lord Jesus Christ fasted and prayed in the desert. Following his example, Christians are encouraged to do three things during Lent:

To fast – usually by giving something up (e.g. chocolate, biscuits, alcohol) during Lent. Each of us are asked to think about a small sacrifice we can make in Lent so as to remember the temptations endured by Christ in the desert and the sacrifice of Himself for us on the Cross.

To pray – to make an extra effort to attend Mass on Sundays and also during the week and to put time aside for personal prayer at home. We are blessed at S. Augustine's Church to have the opportunity to worship and pray at Mass, not only on Sundays but during the week too. To give alms – to give financial support to those in need. During Lent S. Augustine's Church will be supporting the charity 'Mission Direct' which gives support to the work of mission and community projects in the poorest of our parishes.

HOLY WEEK & EASTER

The most important week of the year for Christians will be observed at S. Augustine's with daily worship and devotions and the traditional liturgies by which we accompany Our Lord Jesus Christ in his suffering, death and resurrection.

Sunday 29th March Palm Sunday – Holy Week begins

10.00am The Blessing and Procession of Palms and Parish Mass.

We commemorate the Lord's entry into Jerusalem. Palm Crosses are blessed and we hear the account of the Passion of Christ from S. Luke's Gospel.

Monday of Holy Week 10 am, Tuesday of Holy Week 6pm

Wednesday of Holy Week 10 am Mass & Homily

We reflect on the readings of the day and receive Holy Communion

Tuesday 31st March


12 noon The Bishop of Richborough's Chrism Mass in Rochester Cathedral.

At this Mass the Bishop blesses the Holy Oils and priests renew their Ordination Vows in preparation for Easter. All are welcome.

THE EASTER TRIDUUM (The Great Three Days)

Thursday 2nd April Maundy Thursday

7.30pm Solemn Mass of the Lord's Supper & Watch of the Passion



We recall the events of the night when Our Lord gathered with his disciples in the Upper Room and instituted the Eucharist. We then accompany him, present in the Blessed Sacrament, to the Garden of Gethsemane where he invites us to watch with him in prayer.

Friday 3rd April Good Friday

9.30 am Stations of the Cross

The traditional devotion following the Lord as he makes his way to his death on Calvary.

3.00 pm The Liturgy of the Cross

We gather as God's faithful people at the exact time when Jesus died (3pm) to worship him who gave his life for us. We hear the account of his Passion, adore the Cross of Christ and receive Holy Communion.

Saturday 4th April Holy Saturday

7.30 pm The Easter Vigil & First Mass of Easter

The Church begins her celebration of the Resurrection of the Lord with the great and ancient liturgy of Easter night, including the Blessing of the New Fire, Lighting of the Paschal Candle, the Easter Proclamation and Renewal of Baptismal Vows. The Mass will be followed by a Parish Easter Party in the Vicarage. All welcome!

Sunday 5th April Easter Sunday

10.00 am Parish Mass of Easter Day




The season of Easter continues for Fifty Days until the Solemnity of Pentecost Sunday 24th May.
